



## Cambio Climático y Desarrollo (CC & D) - Chile

CC&D is a consulting firm specialised in the promotion, analysis, design and implementation of market-based instruments under the UNFCCC or other international/national initiatives, with the aim of contributing both to the sustainable development and combating global climate change.

Since its establishment in 1994, CC&D has been actively involved in the local and international climate change debate as a source of expert information on technical matters related to these types of instruments, both for the National Environmental Commission (CONAMA) and the Foreign Affairs Ministry of Chile. In this last condition, his principal has been part of the Chilean delegation to the UNFCCC negotiation process since 1996 and member of the CDM Executive Board during 2001-2004.

During the years 2002 - 2003, CC&D carried out the CONAMA-World Bank's National Strategy Study for Implementation of the CDM in Chile, aimed to identify areas in the Chilean economy with a major interest in and potential opportunities for the CDM market, to develop a corresponding project portfolio to illustrate the use of those opportunities and to propose institutional arrangements necessary to facilitate and expedite the use of the CDM by the country.

During the period 2002 -2005, in a consortium with the International Institute on Sustainable Development of Canada and the US Center for Air clean Policy CC&D carried out the project "Building the Capacity of Chile's Transportation Sector for Sustainable Development through the Clean Development Mechanism", sponsored by the Chilean Government and the Canadian Cooperation Agency.

Usually, CC&D offers consultancy services to project proponents in the Latina American region on additionality analysis of project concepts, development of baseline and monitoring methodologies and, in general, all services related to project registrations in the CDM.

### Key personnel

**Eduardo Sanhueza** has a background in chemistry and physics. He holds an M.Sc in Chemistry from the University of Chile and a Ph.D. in Quantum Chemistry from the Uppsala University in Sweden. He has worked in climate change science and policy-development for over a decade. During 1992-2000, he co-ordinated the Climate Action Network in Latin America. Since 1996, he has been member, as consultant, of Chile's National Advisory Committee on Climate Change and part of the Chilean delegation to the UNFCCC. He was elected to a three-year term as an alternate member of the Clean Development Mechanism's Executive Board at its inception in 2001, and had the responsibility of chairing the Working Group on Aforestation and Reforestation issues of this body. He is the head of Climate Change & Development Consultants, a firm based in Chile.
